

APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 1:

Submit your application online by email to international@lakeheadschools.ca, please include the following:

- This completed application form signed by the student and parent(s)
- Photocopy of student's passport (if available)
- Copies of student's transcripts/school records for the last two years in English
- English language proficiency test results (if available)
- Non-refundable \$300 application fee (application fee may be paid by credit card please contact for details)

Step 2:

If all documentation is in order and the application is satisfactory, you will receive a Conditional Letter of Offer and invoice by email.

Step 3:

You will then be sent the following forms to complete and submit:

- Homestay and Custodianship Application from Canada Homestay Network (if applicable)
- Consent to Release International Student Information form
- Up-to-date Immunization Record form
- A video conference interview may be requested to accompany English language proficiency test results

Step 4:

When these forms are completed and submitted and fees are received and approved; an Official Letter of Acceptance and receipt will be issued by Lakehead Public Schools International.

Use the Official Letter of Acceptance, invoice payment receipt and notarized custodianship form from Canada Homestay Network to apply for a visa/study permit with Citizenship and Immigration Canada.

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TUITION REFUND POLICY:

In the event that a student does not come to study at Lakehead Public Schools International or decides to leave the program, the following refund protocol will apply:

Full Refund less the application fee and if applicable, additional wire transfer fee, will be given if Immigration Canada does not approve the study permit. To obtain a refund, a request in writing must include the letter of refusal from Immigration Canada and the original letter of acceptance from Lakehead Public Schools International.

Two-Thirds of the tuition fee will be refunded if a student withdraws prior to the commencement of the program.

One-Half of the tuition fees will be refunded if the student withdraws after the commencement of the program but before 30 calendar days have elapsed.

No Refund will be granted to a student who:

- Withdraws 30 days after the commencement of the program.
- Is dismissed from the program due to a breach of the law, policy or regulation as determined by the Government Canada, any of the official law enforcement agencies that operate in Thunder Bay and the District, LDSB and / or LPSI.
- All refunds requested and approved by administration will be returned to the individual or company who paid the fees.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- Lakehead District School Board (LDSB) / Lakehead Public Schools International (LPSI) is not liable for losses /
 expenses that may incur as a result of LDSB being unable to provide education owing to labour disputes, inclement
 weather conditions or other causes beyond its control.

 injury suffered by the applicant during periods of travel and study. If the applicant becomes ill or incapacitated LDSB /
 LPSI and its representatives may take such action as it considers necessary, including securing medical treatment and
 transporting the applicant home at his/her expense.

Beginner

- Basic competence is limited to familiar situations
- Understand, read and retell simple stories
- Give and respond to straightforward directions and instructions
- · Write assertive, negative and interrogative sentences
- Write a short structured composition following a model

High Beginner

- Maintain face-to-face conversations on familiar topics
- Use short sentences to give opinions
- Skim a paragraph to find main idea and scan text to find specific information
- Write simple and compound sentences in answering written questions
- Write a short composition following a teacher's outline

Intermediate

- Can use and understand fairly complex language in familiar situations
- Take part in conversations on a range of topics
- Take notes from a passage in preparation for writing
- Identify a writer's or character's point of view
- Use a variety of simple, compound and complex sentences with some accuracy
- Write short expository paragraphs in response to a reading

High Intermediate

- Generally handles complex language well and understands detailed reasoning
- Discuss or explain ideas or issues
- Identify and explain literary elements (theme character, plot and setting)
- Identify facts and opinions
- Write a passage of 3 or more paragraphs to develop a central idea

Advanced

- Fully operational command of the language and handles complex detailed argumentation well
- Express, support and elaborate a point of view
- Analyze literary elements (themes, character, plot, setting)
- Infer meaning of unfamiliar words from context
- Write a coherent response to literature which analyses, interprets, and evaluates information and ideas
